Their disbelief and incredulity was genuine and very vocal. Now that struck me as a 'defining moment'. Evidence of a real sea change. It may have taken twenty years, but every step of the way has been worth it. Now that's what I call progress!

What doesn't change is my appreciation of the hard work of our trustees, staff, volunteers, partner organisations and Traveller families and friends who make LTI the success that it is. And of course, our fantastic funders, who make it all possible. Thank you.

We continue to work in harmony with Clip Community Learning, Healthwatch Lincolnshire, Lincolnshire Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, Lincolnshire Oral Health Team, and the Sexual Health Team to achieve our aim of healthier, safer, Traveller communities across the County.

Key to this is our enormously successful and supportive Gainsborough Well Woman group. We now have three Well Woman Groups at various stages of development each dramatically improving the health and wellbeing of the members.

Alongside regular Well Woman Health Checks and Personal Fitness Trainer Sessions, in the year 2018/2019 the group has attended events such as Mental Health First Aid, Developing a Positive Mindset, First Aid at work, Sexual Health checks, Inspired Healthy Living and Healthy Eating Course, Introduction to Reflexology and Aromatherapy and Essential Oils.

The group has also been involved in fund raising fitness events such as the Lincoln 'Pretty Muddy' 5k run from which they raised money to fight cancer. They were finalists in the Acis Neighbourhood Awards and also organised a fabulous family Halloween Event!

Our brand-new Learning Bus continues to visit a large number of young Travellers and their families around the whole county who are on Elective Home Education.

It is small and cosy, and the learners feel a strong sense of ownership of their Learning Bus. It comes to their site or home, where they feel safe and secure. It can be moved for field trips, visits and special recreational treats.

Travellers engaging with LTI are not a captive audience—they choose whether to attend or not. Groups are small, teaching is individualised, and relationships are built on respect and a desire to succeed. Most of LTI's teaching takes place either on the bus, in the family home or in very close proximity to the home and thus LTI has a close relationship with the whole family. Indeed, it is not uncommon for other family members, parents and even grandparents, to be involved in their own learning with LTI and thus a sense of 'family learning' evolves. This is very supportive and motivating for the young people.

The aim is to make learning engaging and enjoyable — there are rewards for endeavour and the young people have a lot on involvement in designing their own learning. Everyone works towards recognised qualifications such as the Prince's Trust, Trinity College Arts Award or Functional Skills. The Key factors are fun, self-discipline, hard work and success breeding success.

If you ask Travellers what means the most to them the answer will always come back - family, family, family.



We recently held an Easter Fun Day and there were lots of kids, from babies to teens, mums and dads, grandmas and grandads, plus aunties, uncles and cousins... all joining in to make it a huge success.

LTI is very much aware of the importance of family bonds in the Traveller Community. We see this in the way that extended families often group together and live in close proximity and how those that live far apart meet as often as possible for family get togethers. And now we are beginning to see it in their learning.





When we work with young Travellers the whole family will help and support them. There isn't that line between school and home. We work in and around their homes and before long the parents are engaging with learning for themselves.
